As we move forward and look toward our March 27 student-led portfolio afternoon, where we will focus on individual student progress, we will begin to guide students in setting their own goals and/or in participating and reflecting on their individual growth. Please support this process by noticing when your child works hard. Celebrate and engage in the effort! Vanessa Rodriguez would say that, "Teaching is an interaction that occurs between humans who express a desire to connect with each other and join their knowledge." She states that teaching is the interchange that happens between individuals. Our work is to know each learner, listen to each other, build on strengths and support weaknesses.

We are all learners and we are all teachers. 2015 can bring new experiences for each and every one of us. May we open our hearts to learning and may we teach others with sensitivity and awareness.

Music Notes from Mr. Gillespie



This month in 3rd and 4th grade music the students will be developing their creativity by mixing and producing music. Each third grade student will be using the app "Figure" on the iPad to mix and record a short tune, which includes drums, bass and lead parts. 4th grade students will be exploring the app "Garage Band" and the variety of instruments and sounds they can mix and record. Parents will have the opportunity to listen to what all of the students have created at www.soundcloud.com starting in a few weeks. It will be a fun and creative unit!

In January The 2nd Grade will be having fun with the "boomwhackers", learning to read music and perform with these fun instruments! The students will also begin learning to play the recorder by the end of the month

Select Chorus will begin shortly! This chorus of 3rd and 4th graders will rehearse every Friday at 8am (starting on January 23rd). This group will work on advanced singing techniques and perform select pieces at our Spring Concert. Any student interested in signing up for the Select Chorus should sign up outside the music room starting next week.

The Muddy Brook Band will begin weekly rehearsals on Wednesdays at 8:00 (starting on January 21st). These rehearsals are in addition to the students' regular lesson. Keep up the home practice as we start to learn new and exciting band music!

Orchestra Outlook by Juraye Moran

Welcome back to Muddy Brook Elementary School. The halls are once again full of music before school every day. Our Winter concert was a huge success and we are on to bigger and better things. Advanced students will be learning new bowing styles this month. Better control of the bow will allow them to use slurs and ties. Ask them to show you the difference. Beginning strings will be learning more advanced rhythms using quarter, half, and eighth notes as well as the corresponding rests. Not only will students be able to play with more complicated rhythms, but they will be seeing the correlations between Music and Math hands on. The Perfect Practice Competition also begins this month. Students will track their home and school practice on charts for eight weeks. Parents need to sign each week as I will be notating our good practice routines.

Kindergarten Music with Mrs. Moran will incorporate the holidays of the month. We will be learning about New Year's Customs as well as Martin Luther King Day. We will be learning appropriate songs about these two January events. Students will also further the concept of Loud versus Soft singing through classroom games and songs. During the month of January, students in Pre-K, Kindergarten, and 1st grade will be learning about the instruments of the orchestra. First grade students will continue to work on their rhythm reading and writing this month. You may see some rhythm compositions coming home, so stay tuned! Kindergarten

students will continue to echo, create, and decode rhythm patterns using their voices, their hands, rhythm sticks, and various percussion instruments.

Happy New Year! I hope families are starting 2015 off feeling rested with new goals in mind for a wonderful new year.

~December Recap and a Helpful Reminder~



Our students use computers every day, developing proper keyboarding skills is an important fundamental skill our students need to have. Our 3rd and 4th grade students are focusing on learning proper keyboarding skills. We are focusing on memorizing the home keys, asdf jkl; and becoming comfortable resting our hands on those keys when typing. This is a skill that will only develop with practice. I encourage students to practice at home when possible. If you have access to the internet check out **Dance Mat Typing** at http://www.bbc.co.uk/guides/z3c6tff this is a fun typing game from the BBC. The game has 4 levels, each of which are divided into 3 stages. Fifteen minutes of practice on a regular basis will greatly improve your child's typing proficiency.

Students have been busy applying their keyboarding skills as they created different projects before the Holiday Break. Third and fourth grade created Family Customs booklets. Students learned how to create a PowerPoint document, edit their writing, and create their own illustrations using the program Paint. The final outcomes were beautiful! Stop by the Computer Lab to check out some of the projects on display.

Second grade also focused on word processing, editing, and original digital illustrations. Students had the option of typing a gingerbread poem or writing their own original gingerbread poem, and then through the use of Paint created their gingerbread illustrations.

Second Grade is starting an exciting new unit using the iPads through the use of Scratch Jr, a program created by MIT. Scratch Jr is an introductory programing language that allows younger children to create their own interactive stories and games.

As students code, they learn how to create and express themselves with technology, not just interact with it. In the process, children learn to solve problems and design projects, and they develop sequencing skills that are foundational for later academic success. They also use math and language in a meaningful and motivating context, supporting the development of early-childhood numeracy and literacy.

Third and fourth grade will be focusing on improving their keyboarding skills in conjunction with Lexia and a new resource called Khan Academy. Khan Academy is a free online resource that allows students to practice their math skills by using interactive exercises, videos, and tutorials. As students learn, their activity feeds into reports that show important information such as strengths and weaknesses in a particular concept. This resource will help to provide a math focused personalized learning experience; much like Lexia does for literacy. 1st and 2nd grade are finishing up their fairytales and fable units during the first and second week of January.



Chess Club News


