Music Notes from Mr. Gillespie



Happy Spring!

2nd grade music classes are really beginning to get a handle on the recorder. Over the next month they will be learning recorder pieces for the Spring Concert. The students will also be reviewing good singing technique and starting to learn songs to sing at the Spring Concert.

In April the 3rd and 4th grade music classes will be finishing their study of the "Orff" instruments by learning 2 pieces to practice and perform together. Each piece will involve 4 or 5 different instrumental and singing parts that happen simultaneously. They will also begin learning their Spring Concert songs. This year our concert theme is "Movie Songs".

The Muddy Brook Band and Select Chorus are in the process of practicing their Spring Concert music. Weekly rehearsals before school are helping these ensembles grow and improve.

Parents: don't forget to sign your child in to their 8:00 lessons and/or rehearsals!

Orchestra Outlook by Juraye Moran

During the month of April, Advanced string students will be preparing for their Strings on Tour concert. It will be held on May 1st a Friday afternoon beginning at 1:30. Students will be travelling alone and in small groups to every classroom. They will perform a short piece and be able to answer some questions from their audiences. Parents are invited to attend and will gather in the Community Room. This year we have over 20 advanced 3rd and 4th grade Advanced string students. This is also a very busy month for beginner string students as they are preparing for their Spring Concert later in June. Parents are also reminded to sign in right outside the stage door each morning when dropping off students for early morning string lessons.

Morning Kindergarten music classes are learning about the differences between solos, duets and trios. They are all getting the opportunity to sing in these groups with their classes. Songs about animals are the theme this month. Students will be singing about monkeys, whales, roosters and many more. Ask your child to share their new songs at home.



Welcome to the Technology Lab

2nd Grade

Students have been focusing on developing keyboarding skills. We will continue that practice as well as put it to work as students conduct a short research project. They will choose an animal and collect information about the animal's diet, habitat, and life cycle. This information will be displayed on a fact sheet created in Word. Students will then exercise their mouse finger as they explore Paint, a digital drawing tool. Their task will be to create a picture of their animal in its habitat using various digital tools such as the marker, circle, shape, line, paint bucket, color picker and more. Look for these projects to come home in early May.

3rd Grade

The 3rd grade is beginning a study of the American Revolution in classrooms. In technology we will be supporting that learning with a Biography project. Students will choose a notable person from that time period to study. They will use teacher-selected internet resources to locate, collect, and organize information about that person's life. This project will give students an opportunity to demonstrate proper keyboarding skills and techniques. As well apply what they have learned about word processing (i.e., font size/style, line spacing, margins) to format, edit, and print a document.

4th Grade

Students are busy working in pairs on an exciting project that will be featured during the 4th grade Regions Fair in June. They are working in both Technology and Library to create a travel video about an American Landmark. Pairs are using teacher selected internet resources to locate, collect, and organize information about their chosen landmark. They are then using that information to plan a travel video that will be created using iMovie on the iPads. This project is providing students with an opportunity to express themselves creatively through the use of technology.

Parents need to know that *Ansel and Clair: Paul Revere's Ride* is an interactive app for kids to learn about the beginning of the American Revolution and about Paul Revere. Ansel and Clair are aliens who come to Earth to learn about this historic time. Puzzles and mini-games (such as matching the 13 colonies by their shapes into a U.S. map or dragging bags of tax money away from angry colonists and toward King George) help kids learn about life in the colonies, from their geography to taxation without representation. Kids can also take photos of things they see and write their observations in a journal. The app includes multiple choice quizzes to check if kids are learning the information.

Library Update



April is National Poetry Month!

In celebration, poetry books will be on display in the library and poetry will be incorporated to varying degrees in each grade level.



Pre-K and Early K will be reading books about Spring throughout the month of April. We will discuss the signs of Spring, what we enjoy about Spring, and will complete activities related to the books we read. We also will read some funny poems!

Kindergarten will be reading some of our new picture books throughout the month of April! We've already had a blast reading *Wednesday* by Anne Bertier and *My Teacher is a Monster (No I'm Not!)* by Peter Brown. It's wonderful discovering new stories and sharing them with our friends.

1st Grade will be exploring different kinds of poems! We have already created acrostic poems, next we will be making "I am..." poems and shape poems. We will be reading a wide range of poetry including some by Jack Prelutsky, Douglas Florian, and Shel Silverstein.



2nd Grade is also exploring different kinds of poems! We have already created concrete poems and acrostic poems. Next we will be making "I am..." poems. We will also be reading poems by Jack Prelutsky, Shel Silverstein, and others. After April Vacation I will be introducing the library's online catalog so students can locate books more independently.

3rd Grade is finish up their Atlas project and has started exploring dictionaries. We discussed the different parts of a dictionary and how they can find entries quickly. After April Vacation we will begin studying biographies and students will create a biography about a classmate.

4th Grade is in the midst of their major project for the 2nd half of the year! In both library and technology, students are researching a U.S. Landmark with the ultimate goal of creating a video convincing people to visit their landmark. Once they have completed their research, they will write scripts, find pictures, and finally film their video using iMovie. These videos will be shown at the Regions Fair in June.

Students are making connections to other learning in class and personal interests. We are now in the midst of our nutrition unit which combines movement with making healthy food/drink choices.


