The final days of PARCC testing are in May. Third graders participate May 12, 26, and 27. Fourth graders participate May 13, 19 and 20.



String students are preparing for their Spring Concert to be held the afternoon of June 5th. I am so impressed with the progress of the beginning students. They have mastered the Advanced pieces and will be playing with the Advanced students at the concert. This is a first. So proud of the hard work the Advanced students have been doing preparing for their Strings on Tour afternoon. Many have been practicing every morning before school. Thank you to the parents for delivering them early. Please remember to sign in when you walk your string student into the school for before school lessons.

EK and Kindergarten morning music classes are also busily preparing song for their Spring concert to be held on Thursday May 21st at 2:00 PM. Our theme is Animals Animals Animals. Both Ms. Gutter and myself will use this opportunity to demonstrate some of the fun musical activities we do in our music classes. Students are asked to wear a white shirt or blouse and black pants or skirts on concert day.



Welcome to the Technology Lab

2nd Grade

Students are creating fact sheets about an animal featured on The San Diego Zoo Kids website. Students choose an animal that they were interested in and collected facts about their diet, habitat, and life cycle. Students are typing the facts on a word document that they formatted. Students will then exercise their mouse finger as they explore Paint, a digital drawing tool. Their task will be to create a picture of their animal in its habitat using various digital tools such as the marker, circle, shape, line, paint bucket, color picker and more. Look for these projects to come home in early May.

3rd Grade

Students are immersed in researching Colonial Americans for their Biography booklet project. Students have chosen a notable person from that time period to study. They are using teacher-selected internet resources including Britannica to locate, collect, and organize information. This project will give students an opportunity to demonstrate proper keyboarding skills and techniques. As well as apply what they have learned about word processing (i.e., font size/style, line spacing, margins) to format, edit, and print a document.

4th Grade

Students are continuing to working in pairs on an exciting project that will be featured during the 4th grade Regions Fair in June. They are working in both Technology and Library to create a travel video about an American Landmark. Pairs are using teacher selected internet resources to locate, collect, and organize information about their chosen landmark. They are then using that information to plan a travel video that will be created using iMovie on the iPads. This project is providing students with an opportunity to express themselves creatively through the use of technology.

Library Update

May is here and so is the warm weather!

In the library we're embracing the new month and beginning new units of study in every grade.

PreK, EK, and Kindergarten are exploring the new picture books we have in the library! Each week we will read one of the new books we have in the library and complete a related activity. The students are very excited to experience these new books and many have taken them home. The books we will be reading include: *The Lion and the Bird* by Marianne Dubuc, *Sam & Dave Dig a Hole* by Mac Barnett, and *Three Bears in a Boat* by David Soman.



Stock up for summer reading

1st Grade will be studying the author Lisa Campbell Ernst. This past week I introduced her and some of her books and the students did an info hunt to find out facts about Lisa Campbell Ernst. Over the next few weeks we will be reading her books and completing related activities. The books we will be reading include: *Ginger Jumps, The Luckiest Kid on the Planet, The Three Spinning Fairies,* and *The Gingerbread Girl Goes Animal Crackers*.

2nd Grade will be researching the United States to correspond with their ancestry unit in the classroom. As they learn about the countries their ancestors came from, I thought it would be exciting to learn about the different states and why people may have moved here. Students will be working in pairs to find out key information about one of the states in the US. They will research the state symbols, important people, landmarks, state flag, and other fun facts. Students will also create a map of their state and all of the state maps will be put together to create a map of the United States.

3rd Grade will be exploring and writing biographies. This past week students spent some time exploring one of the biographies in the library. Over the next few weeks students will be working in pairs to interview each other and write a biography about their classmate. The students will then be able to take home their biography.



4th Grade is in the midst of a US Landmarks project in conjunction with technology. In both specials they are writing a script and filming a video about the landmark they researched. Their goal is to convince people to visit their landmark by sharing facts in a fun and interesting manner. The videos will be shown at the Regions Fair at the end of the year.




