- Spend 20 minutes playing with your child. Have your child draw a picture of something they did on the "What did you do today?" worksheet.
- □ Counting around the house. Use the worksheet included in this packet to complete the counting activity.
- **Complete the weather and calendar worksheet.**
- Letter practice. Go through the "Fundations alphabet" chart together. Have your child say the letter, picture, and letter sound. Find the letter that your child's name starts with. What other things can you think of that start with that letter? Practice writing your name.
- Snack/Meal time- Eat a snack or meal together and talk about different food groups, colors of food, and how they taste.








Blizzard bag modifications for students with IEPs

ACTIVITY	SUGGESTED MODIFICATIONS
Story retelling	<ul> <li>-Have your child point to pictures in the book and you can name the items your child points to.</li> <li>-Have your child name the pictures in the book.</li> <li>-Have your child turn the pages in the book to show you his/her favorite page.</li> </ul>
Calendar/Weather	<ul> <li>Bring your child to look out the window with you. Have your child tell you what he/she sees or tell your child what you see (snow on trees, ice, clouds, etc.).</li> <li>Talk about what you did yesterday and things you will do tomorrow.</li> </ul>
Play time drawing	-Give your child choices of things they did (i.e hold up a block and a ball and say "What did we do today?"). Draw the item the child chose and have the child color it in.
Letter practice/name practice	<ul> <li>-Focus on just the first letter of your child's name rather than writing the whole name or have your child trace his/her name after you write it.</li> <li>-Have your child repeat the letters after you rather than naming them independently.</li> <li>-If you are not yet working on letters, work on identifying shapes/colors/objects when given 2 choices.</li> </ul>
Counting game	-Have your child repeat the counting sequence after you. -Hold your child's hands and tap the items with your child's hand as you count them.
